### CHRIST LETS WEAK CHRISTIANS DIE

LOUD VOICE, "LAZARUS,

COME FORTH."

JOHN 11:43

When Christ heard that Lazarus was sick. "He stayed two days longer in the place where He was." He chose to be silent, but He was not deaf; and He remained inactive, but He was by no means indifferent. He always works with the greatest blessing in mind, hence He let a weak man die.

A wise lifeguard will not move immediately to rescue a drowning man, rather he waits until all the man's strength is exhausted

before he can save him. Christ must wait until all our efforts to produce godliness are exhausted before He can save us by His indwelling life. While we repeatedly give our best effort to produce godliness, His love holds Him back, allowing us to come to the end of ourselves. "The greatest blessing God can give to a

man is the knowledge of his own destitution."

Humanly speaking, Christ came to Lazarus too late. He was already dead. Death is human weakness taken to its greatest degree. Because Christ overcomes death, He can overcome any other weakness we bring to the Christian life. But His love compels Him to wait until our efforts are exhausted and the only thing we can contribute to the Christian life is our own death. But there is freedom in death: a dead man does not worry if he is able, he knows he's not; a dead man does not compare himself with others ability, he knows he has none to offer; a dead man can be insulted by others, it doesn't hurt him. The gravestone which stands over our buried efforts reads, "R.I.P". A dead man is at rest.

The greatest discovery Lazarus made in the

Christian will make is in the grave of his own selfeffort. Then comes the revelation of God whose word penetrates our hearts, "Christian, come forth!". At that moment, all the struggle will have been worth it, for we have learned that His life, not ours, is the only thing which counts before God.

Thank God, He lets weak Christian die in order that Christ might live.

Another participant shared her gratitude for the prayer support from other Bible Camp participants during a period of illness in her family.
