MAINTENANCE PROJECTS

once again allowed to carry out minor renovations in 2022.

Through Jesus' faithfulness and care, the necessary funds were available. In addition, the Lord gave us success and great cooperation with the companies involved.

One of these measures was the replacement of the carpet in the dining and lecture hall. Christoph Hils was able to remove the old flooring and do some sanding work with our FSJs and some student volunteers. Thus, it was possible to save some of the estimated costs through our own efforts. Through good planning

and preparatory work, this action could be completed in only one week, despite the narrow time window before Christmas.

The second project we undertook was in the dorm bathrooms. In the 3-person showers, the tile joints had been deteriorating. To prevent moisture from penetrating the walls, urgent action was required. A quick and good solution for this was to glue thin plastic sheets onto the existing tile surface. This method has already proved successful in the Bodenseehof kitchen. The seamless surface has also made cleaning much easier. We carried out this work on the



ground floor and 2nd floor in the week before Christmas, and in January and February, we completed this work in the basement and 1st floor

Thus our faithful Lord Jesus provides daily, in large and small things, glory be to Him and to our Father in heaven for all of this!



STUDENT TESTIMONY

From the 2nd to 7th of February 2023, Kilian Müller and Tabea Messner took a team on outreach to Neubrandenburg in northeastern Germany. This is now the fourth time Bodenseehof has partnered with a Brandenburg ministry called "Oasis" to organize youth day camps in the midst of a large apartment-block neighborhood. Merna, a student from Egypt, was part of this team and shares:

Imagine this scene: a place full of darkness, hurt, wandering, hopelessness, pain, and souls crying out for help. This was what I felt emanated from the youth and neighborhood we visited in Neubrandenburg. As soon as we arrived to lead day camps for the youth, I had the expectation that only a few kids would come, or maybe no one at all. But God had other plans.

During the first day, we walked around the youth center talking with each other and

having fun. To my surprise, the kids seemed to think we were cool and this encouraged them to come to the youth days. I had prayed for the youth, but I had especially asked God to bring someone across my path who spoke Arabic, my mother tongue, so that I might be able to share the life of Jesus with them in our heart language. This didn't seem likely in this neighborhood.

But on the second day of the camp, in walked a teenager. Within a minute of conversation, I came to discover that he was an Arab Muslim! I was thrilled, but also nervous, as I didn't want him to no longer listen or refuse to come back if I started to talk about Jesus. But God's Spirit gave me the boldness and words to share. To my great surprise, he didn't disengage, but instead asked who Jesus is and how he could talk with Jesus! This boy did not surrender his life to Jesus in this moment but we did pray together. He heard the Good News of Jesus

and I pray that this seed might come to bear fruit in both his own and others' lives.

During this week, our team had the tremendous joy of welcoming one of the other youth into God's family! God is most certainly at work. He keeps taking care of His children, shows up in the darkest places and reveals that His power is sufficient (2 Corinthians 12:9). Please pray that the Oasis staff would be strengthened and unified as they continue to proclaim the excellencies of Christ, that those who've surrendered to Jesus would persevere, and finally that those who have yet to know His hope would be drawn near.

"The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shone" (Isaiah 9:2).

BIBLE SCHOOL 2022-23

Early this year, one of our students informed me about why he decided to come to Bible school. He told me that he wouldn't normally want to come to a place like this, but explained that there was someone from his hometown who had come to Bodenseehof a few years ago.

He said, "Steve, this is what I know: when this guy left for Bodenseehof, he didn't seem to care about me at all, but when he came back, he genuinely loved me. Something happened at Bodenseehof and that's why I decided I wanted to come."

I was encouraged because that's what I want for all of us – that we would have ever deepening encounters with Jesus that increasingly transform our lives and expand our love for others.

As the year progressed, the time with the students went well and they were incredibly open to learn, grow, and take steps forward—as well as to serve. The main word that comes to mind to describe the situation here is "ripe." Although many things we face are not easy, there still is a great readiness to respond to Jesus and His way, His kingdom, LIFE and all the hope He brings. Both with the students and on outreach, it feels like every time we host, pray, serve, teach, preach, counsel...people are eager and hungry to grow, move forward, and take steps of faith. At the same time—both among our students and the others we work with – we are encountering more and more people who are

affected by serious trauma of various sorts. In some cases, the pain of their situation has been exacerbated by people in the past who misapplied "Bible ideas" in some very complex and sensitive matters. As important as prayer and Bible reading may be, they certainly are not magical spiritual fairy dust; you can't simply wish yourself out of trauma with some

Bible verses and your pre-frontal cortex.

We are learning and growing as we walk with our students and guests in engaging with some of these situations. In the process, we are seeing Jesus bring freedom in people's lives in ways which seemed impossible. In fact, the phrase "I'm free!!" encapsulates what we've heard over and over again in the last couple of years as people express their exuberance – having experienced freedom from bitterness, addiction, sin, anxiety or depression.

This is one of the great joys of the work here: seeing people meet God and walk in new freedom, hope and life in Christ.

Actually, that's what our year verse is about – God doing the seemingly impossibly good. It comes from Ephesians 3:20-21. "Now to Him who is able to do far more abundantly than all

that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

As is often the case, the content of this verse and its context have been the theme of much of what we've been experientially learning this year.

One situation after another has led us to think: Wow! God is able to do more than we can imagine! And the incredible power to do this is already available and at work within us by His Spirit.

We – (US! NOW!) can actually experience by faith the "life-to-the-fullest" promised in Christ.

As we walk in this, we discover that the love of Christ way surpasses everything we could ever comprehend....and the testimony demonstrates how wonderful Jesus is.

One of the fruits of this? People who didn't care – now love.
